

Oatmeal Spice Cake (Barb & Mae Greve)

Combine: 1 cup Oatmeal
1/4 lb. Margarine
1 1/4 cup Boiling Water
Let stand 20 minutes , tightly covered.

2 eggs
1 c sugar
1 c brown sugar
1 1/3 c flour
1 t. baking soda
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon cinnamon

Mix eggs and sugar. Stir and mix dry ingredient and oatmeal mixture. Bake at 350 degrees. Bake 30 minutes. Cool.

Frosting. *Combine and boil 3 minutes & Cool: 1 cup sugar, 2 Tablespoons flour, 1/2 cup milk, 6 tablespoons margarine, 1 cup raisins. Then add 2 teaspoons vanilla And 1 cup powdered sugar. Stir and frost cake.*
