*Baked, Stewed, Apple Salad, Apple Pie, Apple Crisp, sliced*  
*apple with peanut butter, sliced apple with caramel sauce.*  
*Apple Betty, Apple Dumpling, Apple Cake, Apple Spice*  
*Muffins, Apple Streusel Coffee cake, Applesauce, Apple*  
*Butter, Hot Apple Cider,*

- 2 cups finely sliced cucumbers*
- 3/4 cup finely sliced onions*
- 1/2 cup of sugar*
- 1/2 cup white vinegar*
- 1 teaspoon salt*
- 1/2 teaspoon mustard seed*
- 1/2 teaspoon celery seed*
- 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric*

*In a 2 quart microwave safe bowl, Combine cucumbers, onion, sugar, white vinegar, salt, mustard seed, celery seed, and turmeric. Stir well. Microwave mixture on full power 7 to 10 minutes depending on power of your microwave. Stirring twice during cooking time. Store covered and chilled in refrigerator.*
