**Mom's Coconut Cream Pie**

*By Joni Tietz*

*1/2 cup sugar*  
*1/3 cup cornstarch*  
*1/3 teaspoon salt*  
*2 cups milk*  
*3 beaten egg yolks (save whites for meringue)*  
*2 Tablespoons butter*  
*1 cup flaked coconut, divided*  
*1 teaspoon vanilla*  
*1/4 teaspoon almond flavoring*  
*1 9 inch baked pie shell*  
*Combine sugar, cornstarch, salt, milk and egg yolk.*  
*Cook until thick. Remove from heat and add butter, coconut and vanilla and almond flavoring.*  
*Cool. Pour into the baked pie shell.*

**Meringue-**  
*Combine 3 egg whites, and 6 tablespoons sugar.*  
*Beat until stiff peaks form, spread over filling, sealing the edge.*  
*Sprinkle 1/2 cup coconut on meringue.*  
*Bake pie at 350 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes to Golden brown. Cool pie before cutting. Serves 8.*
