





Cranberry -Orange Glazed Pork Tenderloin

1/2 cup Orange Marmalade

1/4 cup Dried Cranberries

1 Tablespoon White Vinegar

1 Tablespoon of Soy Sauce (low sodium if desired)

A Sprinkle of Crushed Red Pepper

1 Tablespoon of Peanut or Vegetable Oil

1 Pound of Pork Loin

1 cup of low sodium chicken broth

Sprinkle of Ginger

1/4 tsp. of Salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine 1st five ingredients in a bowl, stir.

On stove top heat 1 tablespoon of oil and brown the Pork Loin about 6 minutes on each side.

In baking dish place browned pork loin and spread 1/2 of Orange Cranberry glaze on top.

Sprinkle ginger & salt on top.

Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. In chicken broth.

Spread the remaining half of glaze on top and bake An addition 15 minutes. Let meat set 5 min.
