Green Team Tips

Where can I recycle plastic bags in Wayne?

Plastic bags require a different type of recycling than plastic bottles and containers. Our local grocery stores in Wayne each have plastic bag recycling bins in their stores marked Bag-2-Bag®.

Recycle these plastic bags:

- Plastic retail bags
- Produce bags
- Newspaper Bags
- Dry Cleaning Bags
- Cereal Box liners
- Paper towel and toilet paper wrap
- Over wrap on cases of soda or canned vegetables
- Sealed air pouches aka “air pillows” or “bubble wrap”

Take special steps to recycle these plastic bags:

- Ziploc and other zipper style clear bags with zippers removed
- Amazon-style bubble mailers with all labels cut off

Don't recycle these plastic bags:

No water softener bags, pet food bags, candy bags, or frozen food bags.

If in doubt, throw it out. Only recycle what is on the list. Note, the Wayne Recycling & Transfer Station (RTC) does NOT accept plastic bags for recycling.

Reusable Bag Credit Program: Shop with reusable bags at Pac N Save and Quality Foods and get 5¢ off for each bag. You can also donate your bag credits to a local organization at each store—check store signs for the current recipient. Thank you to Quality Foods for starting the donation option!

PREVENTING FROZEN PIPES

With February's cold temperatures, keep cabinets open under sinks along exterior walls to allow warm air to circulate around plumbing. This simple step can help prevent frozen pipes and costly repairs during extended cold snaps.

Bonus tip: letting faucets drip slightly on the coldest nights can also reduce pressure and lower the risk of pipes freezing.
